This full-time position at Chiba University Nishi Chiba campus involves the following duties:

- assisting with the management and coordination of English House
- teaching credited and uncredited classes at the English Support Centre in English House
- advising and teaching individual students and staff
- advising students in language learning strategies and autonomous language learning
- materials development
- possibility of the opportunity to accompany students on short study abroad trips
